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Resolving Variation: Listeners, Learners & Grammar Katherine Demuth (Macquarie University)

Researchers have long been aware of 'the invariance' problem, where listeners and learners must determine underlying representations from variable surface forms. Some of this variation may be contextually induced, or may be a result of different speakers, different dialects or different speaking conditions. Much of this research has focused on the level segments/phonemes. Much less is known about how similar types of variability are dealt with by children in the morphological domain. This talk will explore some of these challenges, reporting on recent findings exploring listeners and learners' sensitivity to allomorphic variation and more. These results suggest that young learners are highly sensitive to all kinds of variation, rapidly constructing robust linguistics representations despite surface variation.
